
Funding

Inspired by our projects in Lebanon and the Netherlands, we concluded that if we value what we are doing we need a financial foundation to sustain our activities.


From that moment on we are looking for funding and try to make sense of all possibilities there are to create revenues. This year we created a Funding Strategy and formulated some principals. One of them is that we will fundraise ourselves because it is key to our success and we will build 'warm' relationship with our funders. We will build long term relationship with funders. We will keep involvement and ask for specific help, e.g. round table with specific goals and questions.

Results in 2018

- Angel funder: Patrik Forrer
- Secured Swiss Cooperation fund of \$11.000,- in cooperation with Beam (\$22.000,- in total).
- Continuous funding from Woltjer Stichting
- Funding from Hivos for 2 Hummingbirds programs in 2019: € 56.428,-

Projects in Lebanon

The Hummingbirds program is a leadership training for young women that fosters an empowered perspective. This perspective can be directly transferred into community-based activities. This program invests in peace building: brings different cultures together,

empowerment, inclusiveness, communication and entrepreneurial skills. We aim to create a Youth Network of Peace Builders, who support each other.

Results 2018

- We trained the Hummingbirds group (20 Syrian refugees and 20 Lebanese Girls) in July and in November
- We executed the first train-the-trainer in Beam center in Lebanon
- Rosa van Halm, teacher Huygens in the Netherlands, joined the training in Lebanon
- Joelle Verkooijen was reporter in Lebanon and help create a cookbook, that will be for sale in 2019



• We executed an entrepreneurial project with the first Hummingbirds group. New dreams for deepening the learning of the tribe. They are looking for support for two projects: hairdressers, giving them the opportunity to start working and Art Lab for expression.

Impact

Building on training given in July and August 2018 we executed the following projects November 2018 to deepen the learning. This project covered:

- Hummingbird retreat I Empowerment and self esteem
 - 38 Lebanese and Syrian girls were trained in leadership skills
- Entrepreneurial projects

Creative Bus - 62 children (Lebanese & Syrian), enjoyed a creative afternoon.

Creative Lab – At two places in Aley creative materials are available to do workshops for the community.

Hairdressing – An 8 hour workshops is giving to 8 Syrian girls to give them more work opportunities.

- Train-the-trainer

Seven members of Beam and two persons from Amsterdam (a teacher and a photographer) were trained as trainers for the first retreat about Self-esteem.

Impact of this program is 654 people - direct 109 and indirect 545

Projects in the Netherlands

On the International Day of Peace on 21 September 2018, the second edition of the Peace

Challenge was organized in Amsterdam. Young people from different backgrounds came together and executed challenges. We celebrated similarities and embrace the differences. At the end of the day they interviewed Mpho Tutu from Furth and showed their results to the alderman Marjolein Moorman. On the International Day of Peace, we make the difference by linking our passions and talents to the greatest need at school and in the city and the world: Peace!



Results 2018

- Peace Challenge 2018, celebrating Peace Day with same team and good after movie
- Two recurring participating schools: Huygens College- Amsterdam and Bernard Nieuwentijt College -Monnickendam
- New school: VOX-Klassen for Peace Challenge 2018 and 2019.



Impact

On 21 September we celebrated the Peace Challenge at Vox- klassen with 100 children. At the same time Peace Day was celebrated at Bernard Nieuwentijt College with three classes.

Impact of this program is 1.110 people - direct 185 and indirect 925

3 NOTES TO THE BALANCE SHEET AS AT DECEMBER 31, 2018 AND THE STATEMENT OF INCOME AND EXPENSES FOR THE YEAR 2018

GENERAL

GENERAL PRINCIPLES FOR THE PREPARATION OF THE ANNUAL ACCOUNTS

The annual accounts have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of article 396, Part 9 of Book 2 of the Dutch Civil Code.

The valuation of assets and liabilities and the determination of the result are made on the basis of historical cost. Unless stated otherwise at the specific balance sheet item, the assets and liabilities are valued according to the cost model.

Income and expenses are allocated to the year to which they relate. Profits are only included to the extent that they have been realized on the balance sheet date. Obligations and possible losses that originate before the end of the reporting year are considered, if they are known before the preparation of the financial statements.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES FOR THE VALUATION OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES

Cash

Liquid assets comprise of cash, bank balances and deposits with a term of less than twelve months. Current account debts at banks are included under debts to credit institutions under current liabilities. Liquid assets are valued at nominal value.

Current liabilities

Short-term debts are valued at fair value on initial recognition. Short-term debts are valued after amortization at amortized cost. Where there is no (discounted) premium and transaction costs, the amortized cost price is equal to the nominal value.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES FOR RESULT DEFINITION

General

The result is determined as the difference between the realizable value of the services rendered on the one hand, and the costs and other expenses of the year, on the other hand, valued at historical cost prices.

Determination of the result

The result is determined as the difference between the net turnover and the costs and other expenses of the year under review, with due observance of the abovementioned valuation principles. Profits are accounted for in the year in which the goods were delivered or the services were provided. Losses that originate in the financial year are considered as soon as they are foreseen.

Benefit

Net turnover is understood to mean the proceeds from the goods delivered and services provided during the year under review, after deduction of discounts and taxes levied on turnover.

Revenue arising from the sale of goods is recognized when all significant rights to economic benefits as well as all major risks have passed to the buyer. The cost price of these goods is allocated to the same period.

Project costs

Project costs are directly related to the projects.

Operating expenses

The costs are determined with due observance of the aforementioned principles of valuation and allocated to the reporting year to which they relate.

Taxes

Corporate income tax is calculated at the prevailing rate on the result of the financial year, taking into account permanent differences between the profit calculation according to the annual accounts and the tax profit calculation, and where deferred tax assets (if applicable) are valued only to the extent that the realization is likely.
